JOHN Chapter 9


Note from Kathy

- 12. How did the religious leaders respond to this man's boldness for Jesus?
- 13. Jesus heard the man he healed was thrown out of the synagogue by the Pharisees. Jesus wants the man to know that even though he is suffering persecution today, that he can have hope and a future. Jesus continues to help him see the truth concerning who it was who gave him his sight. According to John 9:38, what did this man do to prove his salvation was real?

Read Romans 10:9-10 to clarify this man's response that day.

- 14. In verses 39-41, Jesus spoke to those who did not recognize the need for a relationship with God and those who presented themselves as ones who had a relationship with God. What did Jesus say would be the outcome for each when the truth was presented:

 - b. Those who profess to see (prideful arrogance)

Application

- 1. Quite often doctors can perform a surgery or administer medicine to restore someone's sight. How were the events of John 9 totally different than what medical doctors do today?
- 2. The disciples asked Jesus, "Who sinned, this man or his parents that he was born blind?" If it were the man who had sinned, when would he have had to do it?

Is that even possible?

The disciples assumed that punishment for "sin" was the cause of bad things in life. Can you think of a time when you found yourself judging another person's bad situation, rather than considering how you could help them in their situation?

3. Jesus had not come to point fingers and assign blame. Jesus came to do his Father's will. Jesus says in Luke 19:10, "The Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." Jesus moved with compassion as he went about doing the will of his Father who sent him. Does the word "compassion" describe how you go about your daily activities?

Briefly share an example of you extending unplanned compassion this week.

- 4. Jesus spit and made a mud salve for the man's eyes and told him very specifically where to wash them. This seems an unusual assignment. Has God ever given you an unusual assignment as an answer to a life-long prayer? Did you immediately obey?
- 5. The man's neighbors saw him walking around unassisted—he was no longer blind. They questioned him as to how this could be. Did the man have a full understanding and explanation?

What did he share with them?

Are the workings of God in our life something we can explain?

Share a time when God miraculously and unexplainably moved in your life or the life of someone dear to you.

6. The Pharisees were divided in their opinion of Jesus and his miracles. When the man who had been healed was asked what his opinion was he simply responded that his eyes had been opened. Do you ever feel like the blind man?

You know the change the Lord has brought in your heart and life, but you can't explain how He did it. How are you different because of your relationship with Jesus?

- 7. If you have never written your personal testimony, let me share with you a plan that will help. Clear some time to sit and write the events that led to your personal encounter with Jesus. It may take several pages. Now, eliminate as many details as you can until it's one or two paragraphs. Take a lesson from the blind man's testimony of John 9, I was blind all my life until one day I met Jesus, and now I see. Have fun writing. - 8. The Pharisees questioned the man's parents to verify he was born blind. The parents were afraid to say too much because they had heard the Jewish leaders intended to put out of the synagogue anyone who acknowledged Jesus was the Messiah. Can you recall a time when you were silent concerning your faith for fear of what someone might think, say or do? Briefly explain.
- 9. In verses 24-34 we saw the boldness of this man as he addressed the accusations of the Pharisees, and we see it came at a cost. He was thrown out of the temple that day. How has sharing the good news of the gospel cost you?

We do not want to go around starting conversations that will spark trouble, but are you ready to share what Jesus has done for you if you're asked?

10. The blind man that Jesus healed acknowledged the gift of sight could only come from God. He also said that God does not listen to sinners, but listens to godly people who do his will. Psalms 34:15-16, Psalms 66:16-18 and Psalms 145:17-20 all teach that God hears the
