Genesis 2:15-17 *“The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it. ¹⁶And the LORD God commanded the man, “You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; ¹⁷but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from it you will certainly die.”*

Genesis 3:1 *Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, “Did God really say, ‘You must not eat from any tree in the garden’?”*

John 10:14 *“I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me—”*

John 10:27 *“My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me.”*

Listen (Greek Akouo) to perceive w/ears, to comprehend, to understand

Know (Greek Ginosko) to know and to become known in an intimate way

Follow (Greek Akoloutheo) to follow one who proceeds as his attendant, to join as a disciple

1 Peter 4:12-16 *TPT Beloved friends, if life gets extremely difficult, with many tests, don't be bewildered as though something strange were overwhelming you. ¹³ Instead, continue to rejoice, for you, in a measure, have shared in the sufferings of the Anointed One so that you can share in the revelation of his glory and celebrate with even greater gladness! ¹⁴ If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are greatly blessed, because the Spirit of glory and power, who is the Spirit of God, rests upon you. ¹⁵ Let none of you merit suffering as a murderer, or thief, or criminal, or as one who meddles in the affairs of others. ¹⁶ If you suffer for being a Christian, don't consider it a disgrace but a privilege. Glorify God because you carry the Anointed One's name.*

Daniel 9:27 (speaking of the 7 year Tribulation Period) *He will confirm a covenant with many for one 'seven.' In the middle of the 'seven' he will put an end to sacrifice and offering. And at the temple he will set up an abomination that causes desolation, until the end that is decreed is poured out on him."*

An abomination is "something that causes disgust or hatred".

Desolation is "a state of complete emptiness or destruction."

Jesus warned that something (or someone) that people detested would stand in the temple someday.

Daniel predicted the following:

1. A future ruler will make a treaty with the people of Israel.
2. The terms of this treaty will be for a "week" — a period of seven years.
3. Midway through this time, the ruler will gather his troops and put an end to the sacrifices and offerings in the temple.
4. At that time the ruler will desecrate the temple, setting up some type of sacrilegious object.
5. The desecration of the temple will continue until the judgment of God is finally meted out on the ruler and his followers, 1,290 days (3½ years) later.

Matthew 28:18-20 *"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.¹⁹ Therefore go and make disciples of all nations baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."*
